About the 2007 Distinguished Service Award

Bill and Midge Arnold have given generously of their time and talents to Saw Mill River Audubon for more than 25 years. **Bill Arnold** was instrumental in design and installation of the office entrance remodeling of Pruy House as well as the design of Pinecliff Sanctuary's wheelchair accessible boardwalk. Bill has also been a valued member of the Finance Committee for Saw Mill River Audubon. **Midge Arnold** championed the idea of a Butterfly and Hummingbird Garden and also the arboretum at Pruy Sanctuary, led the original design of the garden and coordinated the first planting of perennials and annuals. Midge served for more than 20 years on the Board of Directors of Saw Mill River Audubon. They, together, lovingly oversee the upkeep of the garden and arboretum to this day.

The Travelers Rest dates back to 1876. The beautiful ambiance of the formal gardens, waterfall, pond and gazebo make this a perfect setting for a spring reception.
