
Special Workshop: Shorebird Identification

Friday, March 28, 7:30 pm Chappagua Library

Saw Mill River Audubon is cosponsoring this workshop on shorebird identification presented by renowned wildlife photographer and author Kevin T. Karslon. This event is free, open to the public, and suggested for ages 10 and up.

As well as showing examples of his awardwinning photography, Kevin will discuss his philosophy of "birding by impression." Beginners and experienced birders alike can use Kevin's techniques to get a handle on the tricky business of shorebird identification.

Kevin is co-author of the comprehensive volume The Shorebird Guide. This 300 page book features beautiful, full-color photographs of shorebirds in all stages of life. It will reinforce the

Haas Sanctuary Expands


Saw Mill River Audubon is pleased to announce that our Haas Sanctuary in the Town of New Castle now protects an additional 7 acres of wildlife habitat.

The Betts family, formerly of Chappagua, transferred ownership of two parcels of land to Saw MIII River Audubon in December. With these additional parcels, Haas Sanctuary now covers 14.5 acres.

Haas and other nearby parcels of protected open space are helping to provide wildlife habitats and wildlife corridors in this eastern edge of the Town of New Castle.

We will be reporting in future issues on our plans to enhance the wildlife habitat of the new parcels for butterflies and eastern bluebirds.

Saw Mill River Audubon extends deep appreciation to the Betts family not only for this valuable donation of property but also for their generous financial support with taxes and transfer fees during the closing process. We are also grateful to SMRA board member Ken Novenstern, Esq. for overseeing the property transfer on behalf of Saw Mill River Audubon.
