Second Saturday Walks at Brinton Brook

This month's second Saturday walk will be part of the Hudson River Valley Ramble taking place throughout the Hudson Valley on four September weekends staring September 8th. We will explore the trails of our Brinton Brook Sanctuary in Croton-on-Hudson for 2 hours and then offer the option for a 1.5 hour extension of our walk on the Village of Croton-on-Hudson's Highland Trail. Sunday, September 9 • 7:00 am (from Millwood) Birding Sandy Hook, New Jersey



Join us for a late summer birding field trip to Sandy Hook. Sandy Hook is a peninsula that projects northward into Raritan Bay at the northern-most point of the New Jersey coast and is one of New Jersey's best year-round birding locations. The photo shows North Pond, near the tip of the peninsula. A major migration path in both spring and fall, Sandy Hook attracts approximately 350 bird species and over 50 species of butterflies to its diverse habitats.

Register by calling 914-666-6503 or emailing office@sawmillriveraudubon.org by Friday, September 7. Meet at 7:00 am at the Millwood A&P parking area for carpooling and caravanning. Bring binoculars and water. We'll have spotting scopes for sharing.

Sunday, September 16 ◆ 9:00 am Hook Mountain Hawk Watch

Hook Mountain, just north of Nyack in Rockland County, offers 360° views of the lower Hudson River valley and eye-level views of the hawks, eagles and falcons migrating south along the Hudson River. Trudy Battaly, an experienced hawk counter, will guide our hawk watching. Meet at 9:00 am at the flagpole by the executive golf course in Rockland Lake State Park. Bring binoculars and water. There is a moderate ½ hour uphill walk to the hawk watch location. Register by calling 914-666-6503 or emailing to office@sawmillriveraudubon.org by Friday, Sept. 14.

Help the Birds by Joining Project FeederWatch



The winter of 2012–13 will mark the 26th year of Project FeederWatch. Anyone with an interest in birds—no matter what skill level—can participate in this winterlong survey of birds that visit backyard feeders, nature centers, and other places throughout North America. By doing so they will help scientists and

policy makers obtain valuable data about the status of the birds that visit our feeders.

Project FeederWatch is operated by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and Bird Studies Canada. There is a small fee to cover the research kit and instructions that each participant receives. More information is available at www.birds.cornell.edu/pfw. The Project FeederWatch website can even help participants identify birds they are unsure about.

Do you eBird?



A real-time, online checklist program, *eBird* has revolutionized the way that the birding community reports and accesses information about birds. Launched in 2002 by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and National Audubon Society, *eBird* provides rich data sources for basic information on bird abundance and distribution. A birder simply enters when, where, and how they went birding, then fills out a checklist of all the birds seen and heard during the outing. Saw Mill River Audubon is using *eBird* to record and share our field trip checklists. Check out *eBird* at www.ebird.org
