Saturday, February 9, 9:00 am-4:00 pm The annual **Hudson River EagleFest**sm, organized by the Teatown Lake Reservation, brings together a broad coalition of organizations united in their goal to promote appreciation of an environmentally healthy and vibrant lower Hudson Valley. Saw Mill River Audubon is pleased to support this exciting, all-day event that brings thousands of people to be awed and inspired by the natural world close to home. This year, eagle spotting locations will be found along the Hudson from Yonkers to



Garrison. The main exhibition tent in Croton Point County Park will have lectures, special exhibits for children and grownups, and theatrical presentations. Two-hour bus tours hosted by environmental educators will leave from the main tent. Visit www.teatown.org/eaglefest for more information and for theater and tour reservations. This year, Saw Mill River Audubon will sponsor warming tents at the boat ramp south of the Croton-Harmon train station parking lot and at George's Island County Park. Volunteers with binoculars and scopes will staff all the eagle spotting locations.

Peter was also a valued board member and board president for SMRA in the 1980s. Peter's passion for conservation is well remembered with this fitting tribute from the Somers Land Trust.

Hurricane Sandy

While we did not have the devastating impacts suffered by many, Hurricane Sandy caused significant tree damage in Saw Mill River Audubon's sanctuaries. We are grateful for the assistance of many volunteers who stepped forward to assess and repair storm damage.

We also note the severe impacts on many coastal wildlife refuges including Jamaica Bay in the New York harbor and extending south to Forsythe (Brigantine) in South Jersey. This historic storm seems to have brought more public attention to the ongoing questions of climate change and shoreline development. How this might translate into public policy changes remains to be seen.

Leadership Camp

This past August I had the great fortune to attend the **Audubon Leadership Camp** in Maine after receiving a generous adult scholarship from SMRA. The camp was established in 1936 on the



333-acre Hog Island, which is now Todd Wildlife Sanctuary, and is designed to introduce adults to the ecology of the Maine coast and encourage wildlife conservation values. About 30 participants from various Audubon chapters along the east coast came together for an inspiring week of educational programs, exciting field work, challenging brainstorming sessions, supportive camaraderie, and just plain fun.

Led by some of the premier naturalists and ornithologists in the country, I learned a great deal about the importance of the Atlantic Flyway Initiative that is the top priority of National Audubon's strategic plan for 2012-2015. This plan emphasizes how Audubon chapters like SMRA can work at the local level to support the work of the Audubon network. By working together, we can make a real impact on bird conservation throughout the western hemisphere. I look forward to offering photographs and video at the SMRA Annual Dinner in April.
